

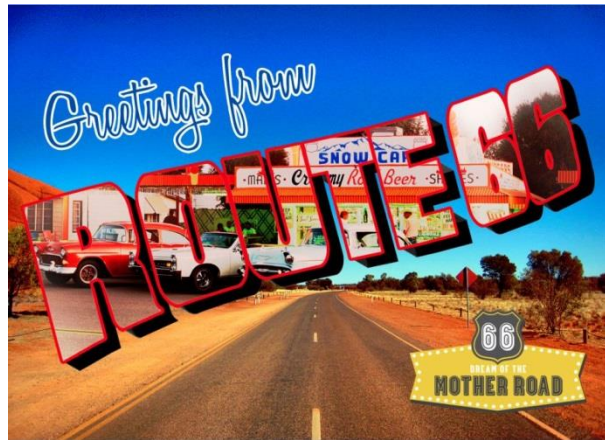


AMERICA'S CAR MUSEUM®

Relive the open road of Route 66 at LeMay–America's Car Museum beginning May 3 Springtime in the Pacific Northwest is guaranteed to feature at least three things – the start of baseball season, tax day and frustrating rainy days. We can't do anything about the first two, but America's Car Museum has you covered on those rainy days.

Opening on May 3, LeMay - America's Car Museum, brings the “**Dream of The Mother Road**” back to life with an immersive, interactive collection of cars and memorabilia to celebrate America's iconic roadway, Route 66.

The exhibit opens to the general public May 3 at 10 am with an Insider Talk by America's Car Museum Chief Curator Scot Keller at 11 am offering background on Route 66. Everyone who attends on the opening weekend will receive a “Greetings from Route 66” postcard that can be mailed for free to friends or family, compliments of the Museum. Opening weekend activities also include a free “plan a road trip” activity in the Family Zone, and anyone who becomes an America's Car Museum member during the opening weekend will have their name entered in a drawing to win a gift basket from the ACM Store.



The Route 66 exhibit features a changing display of 12 different cars from the 1920s through the 1960s, including a 1922 Ford Model T Touring, a 1931 Plymouth PA Roadster, a 1946 Ford Super Deluxe Convertible, a 1954 Pontiac Chieftain Deluxe 8 Station Wagon and a 1965 Mustang Convertible, among other vehicles.

Throughout the Route 66 exhibit, families can participate in a scavenger hunt and plan their next road trip. America's Car Museum offers family fun any day of the week. Rain or shine.
