LeMay – America's Car Museum Kicks Off Year of Concerts, Automotive Shows and Festive Gala

TACOMA, Wash. (Feb. 2, 2015) – There's a misconception that museums are stuffy, static displays of relics of bygone eras. America's Car Museum (ACM), the largest automotive museum in North America, faithfully puts those notions to rest with its "Take a Spin" ride-alongs in vintage cars, lecture series and long list of education initiatives for children and adults.

The Museum also lets loose with its five Signature Events, which *USA Today* describes as atmospheres "oozing with innovation and indulgence."

The first on ACM's calendar is "Drive the Blues Away," a new music event on February 7. It features the Gibson Test Drive Experience in which guests will have the opportunity to see the guitar-maker's model lineup, including a 1-of-50-made Les Paul electric guitar commissioned for the 50th anniversary of the Chevrolet Corvette. The night will also include live music acts and tastings from Pacific Grill and local breweries and distilleries.

"Cars and guitars go hand-in-hand, so creating this event was an obvious choice for us," said David Madeira, ACM's president and CEO. "Drive the Blues Away celebrates that unique relationship music shares with mobility. We're excited to open our doors to guests for this first-time event."

ACM will host four additional Signature Events throughout 2015, including:

- **Wheels & Heels Annual Gala** – June 26 – This year's theme is "Kentucky Derby: A Celebration of Horsepower." The event is ACM's largest annual fundraiser and will include live Bluegrass music, gourmet cuisine, fireworks, a silent auction and, yes, those splendiferous Kentucky Derby hats. ACM also honors the winner of the Nicola Bulgari Award, which is named after jewelry magnate and classic car collector Nicola Bulgari, and awarded annually to individuals who make outstanding contributions to preserve America's automotive heritage through education, car restoration and collecting classic cars.
- **Cars & Cigars** – August 1 – Cars & Cigars is a night of live music, local spirits and signature appetizers from co-host El Gaucho Tacoma, an upscale restaurant. The event is sponsored by Montecristo cigars, with tastings from local wineries and distilleries.
- **Vintage Motorcycle Festival** – August 22 – Known simply as "The MEET at America's Car Museum" or VMF features a concours show for more than 300 motorcycles made prior to 1990, demo rides, vendor booths, free seminars, food trucks and a 78-mile rally from ACM to Mt. Rainier and back. Last year's VMF was the largest yet, drawing more than 2,000 people to ACM's 3.5-acre show field.

- **Pacific Northwest Concours d'Elegance** – September 13 – A gathering of more than 150 of the finest antique and collectible automobiles in the U.S., the Pacific Northwest Concours d'Elegance has grown in size and stature every year since its inception 13 years ago. Vehicle classes for the 2015 Concours include the Elegance of Rolls Royce, Supercars, Packards and “Highway Working Guys,” among others.

“ACM continues to set its focus well beyond the sights of a traditional automotive museum to expand our audience,” said Madeira. “Each year, we strive to put together world-class events, which wouldn’t be possible without our dedicated staff and volunteers.”
