Tacoma, Wash. (Sept. 5, 2019) – America's Car Museum (ACM) has announced that Alan Granberg will be conferred the title of 2019 Featured Collector at the Wheels & Heels Annual Gala, taking place in Tacoma, Washington on September 7.
