America's Car Museum is Like, Totally Gearing Up for RADwood PNW

Celebration of '80s and '90s automotive lifestyle will feature drinks, live music and more

TACOMA, Wash. (July 17, 2019) – America's Car Museum (ACM) will be hosting the 2019 RADwood PNW on Saturday, July 20 to celebrate the '80s and '90s automotive lifestyle in Tacoma, Washington, where hundreds of period-correct vehicles will go on display with dozens of food and drink vendors along with radical tunes from the era.

RADwood held its first show in June 2017, when co-founders Brad Brownell, Rick Deacon, Art Cervantes and Lane Skelton decided that San Francisco needed a car show aimed at those who grew up driving and tinkering on their '80s- and '90s-era vehicles. While the small, static car show had humble beginnings at Brisbane Marina with little more than a taco truck, the automotive community rallied behind RADwood and more than 150 vehicles ended up on display – doubling the expected turnout.

A few months later its second show in Los Angeles had 300 cars. RADwood has since been picking up speed, with five shows in 2018 and 13 scheduled for 2019.

“RADwood is beyond stoked to be joining AVANTS and LeMay for our first show in the PNW,” said RADwood co-founder Brad Brownell. “We've been hearing from locals for the last two years that there is a huge concentration of rad cars and people in the area, and we can't wait to see what they bring to the table. This has the potential to go down as one of the best RADwood events of all time!”

Guests at RADwood PNW can expect a lively gathering of period-correct attire and music – compliments of DJ Scrambler, who will be spinning tracks out of the back of his Jeep Scrambler pickup – as well as food and drink specials from Ruca, Hot Dog Tent, Dev's Ice Cream Truck, Jubilee Burgers, Famous Fiesta Foods, Thirst Responder beer garden and Anthem coffee.

Members of the AVANTS Car Club will be representing Seattle at the event, where hundreds of vehicles are expected to turn out. The event is open to all, and those who'd like to register their cars for RADwood can by visiting RADwood.co.

“We are stoked to welcome RADwood to the Pacific Northwest and are excited to celebrate 80's and 90's cars,” said America's Automotive Trust Vice Chair David Madeira. “If you're in the area, make sure to break out the '80s and '90s clothes you have buried in the closet and come down to the Museum... It's an event you won't want to miss!”

Tickets for RADwood include admission to the Museum, where guests can continue their nostalgic adventure at the “ACM Goes RAD!” exhibit, and get a Back to the Future photo op with a

DeLorean and Doc Brown costumes – an experience extending through August 2 for Cars & Cigars: Miami Nights. Additionally, ACM will be playing The Goonies as part of its summer drive-in movie series on July 27.

Prominently displayed at RADwood will be a trio of radical ACM vehicles: a 1992 Ferrari 512TR Testarossa, 1980 Plymouth Arrow Pickup and 1990 Mercedes Benz 300E-24 AMG.
