Route 66: Vintage Wagons to Remain Stationed at America's Car Museum

TACOMA, Wash. (July 23, 2015) – America's Car Museum (ACM) has announced that due to popular demand, it is extending its Vintage Station Wagon display in the Route 66 Gallery through September 27.

The Route 66 exhibit was updated in 2015 to feature memorable vintage American station wagons that once adorned the iconic highway, including a Ford Ranch Wagon, a Buick Special Riviera 49D Estate Wagon and a trio of Chevy Bel Air Wagons.

“Much like Route 66, station wagons played an important role in the history of the automobile,” said ACM CEO David Madeira. “We decided to extend the closing date to the end of September because so many visitors love the display.”

Known as the “Road to Riches,” Route 66 once gauged a growing American economy and became a permanent part of cultural memory to millions of American families that experienced its countless attractions from Chicago to Santa Monica, California. There are few vehicles that can match the nostalgia of the Mother Road better than the American station wagon.
