TACOMA, Wash. (June 28, 2016) – America's Car Museum (ACM) annually hosts thousands of motorcycle fans, riders and enthusiasts at its Vintage Motorcycle Festival: The MEET at ACM. They come to check out a wide array of cool bikes displayed on its Haub Family Field, and based on a few of the bikes registered for July 30, this will be another must-see event.

Some of the notable bikes heading to The MEET include a 1947 Indian Chief, 1953 Harley Davidson FI and a 1948 Harley Davidson Servi-car – the three-wheeler that laid the foundation for Harley Davidson's current Tri Glide Ultra Classic.

Joining them will be an assortment of eye-catching Japanese, British and Italian classics from manufacturers such as Ducati, Motto Guzzi, BSA, Kawasaki and more.

[With 20 classes for this year's competition](#), plus the prestigious ACM CEO's Award and Best of Show, there are award classes for nearly any bike built before 1991. Guests to the event will also be able to enjoy the Seattle Cossacks Motorcycle Stunt and Drill Team, food trucks, vendor booths, free seminars and a Sunday ride through the Mt. Rainier valley, concluding with lunch at Haub Family Field.

“As always, attendees will get to see a huge variety of the coolest bikes on the planet. That's what makes The MEET so much fun for motorcycle enthusiasts of all ages and their families,” said Vintage Motorcycle Festival Advisory Board Chairman Mark Zenor.

“The camaraderie of riding with a group of friends in places near and far is a huge draw for bikers,” said ACM CEO David Madeira. “As the Vintage Motorcycle Festival continues to grow year-over-year, we always get excited to see what bikes turn out for the MEET and for our Sunday ride to the Mt. Rainer valley.”

Madeira's dedication to motorcycles has taken him through dozens of countries by motor bike, including a trip over Khardung La – the highest pass in the world at 17,380 feet!
