

1955 CHEVROLET 3600











1955 was a transition year for Chevrolet's pickup line. Two pickup styles were offered: the First Series "Advanced Design" introduced in 1947 and the modernized Second Series "Task Force" styling that included the first "wrap-around" pickup truck windshield. Introduced in March of 1955, the Task Force Second Series styling continued through 1959. All Second Series trucks received 12 volt electrical systems and six-cylinder engines were standard equipment, with V8 power available as an option. The ¾ and one ton trucks were also available in stake-bed and platform bed models. The 1955 pickup line was a great success for Chevrolet, with total truck production that year reaching just over 393,000 units.

This restored Chevrolet 3600 ¾ ton Second Series commercial pickup has the same cargo box as the long bed ½ ton pickup truck, but is equipped with larger springs, axles, brakes and tires for a heavier carrying capacity. It is powered by Chevrolet's 235 cubic inch six-cylinder engine matched to a manual four speed transmission.
