









1965 FORD F100

The fourth generation of F100 pickups, introduced for the 1961 model year, received an updated look that included a new re-designed stacked grille, lowered stance, and an integrated cab/bed design offered for the lighter duty truck line. The "Styleside" box design was available on the F100 pickups from 1964 and continued 1966.

The 1965 model year saw a restyled grille plus the introduction of "Twin-I-Beam" front suspension that became standard for the Ford light-duty trucks until 1996. New engine designs were offered transitioning away from the mid-50's Y-blocks to the 352 FE block V-8 and more a lighter and more durable 6-cylinder 240.
